Background

In fall 2018, City Administration and Council will start their 2019 Budget Engagement campaign. This campaign will include numerous engagement tactics that will give residents the opportunities to discuss their community priorities when allocating the 2019 funds.

The City promises to residents is to include them in the engagement, and to listen to their comments and use those comments as constructive feedback when making the final budget decision.

The Jelly Bean Tactic

This tactic will be used at the Colonial Days Pancake Breakfast on Thursday, July 12 at 7 am to 10:30am.

The purpose of this tactic is to identify the long term wishes of the community. This will help Mayor and Council during the 2019 budget process by giving guidance on what amenities residents desire for the community. And will also be used to help shape the future communications as residents will be aware of the upcoming campaign.

- New or enhanced performing arts facilities
- New or enhanced spray parks
- New or enhanced swimming facilities
- New or enhanced trails networks

Tactic Logistics

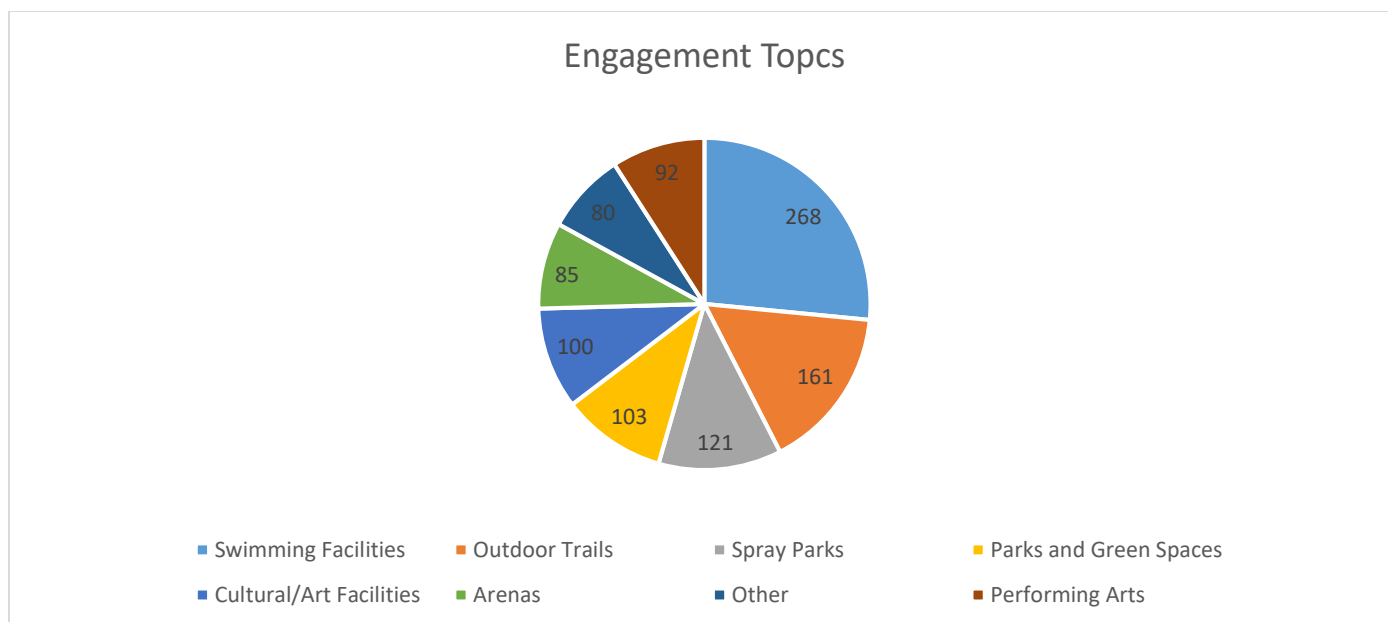
Each resident, who wishes to be engaged, will be given 9-10 jelly beans. From there residents were asked to allocate their beans into the jars which represents the topics above.

Report Finding

Residents were asked to allocate their beans into the wish list items. These statistics were the final counts of jelly beans per jar.

Swimming Facilities	268	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - "50m swimming pool with more and better seating area" - "Can't you do the indoor pool shut down more overlapping when the outdoor pool is still open and not over the Labour Day weekend?"

Outdoor Trails Network	161	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - “Affordable housing – for everyone” - “Cyclists need better trails to be able to do longer/faster rides in a safe environment” - “Trails – mark the nature trail, have paper copies of the trail system”.

Other Visions	80	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - “Disc swing” - “We want a basketball court at Bud Miller” - “Enhanced more visible painted lane markings” - “Biking/walking trails – network by older communities too!” - “New library” - “Roads, streets, avenues are a mess and badly need a big push to get them into better shape” - “Disc swings at parks like in Saskatoon, super fun for the kids” - “more benches” - “Change Bud Miller park to stop allowing dogs. Plant trees around it so we can’t see the houses” - “My first wish is to have the city repair the sidewalk on the north side of my property. Some sidewalks have been renewed – this one is in rough shape and should have been on the repaired list. Second, amazing increase on the new water and garbage bill – why? There are no leaks!” - “I think it would be a wise investment to have a toxic round up more than one a year. Save our sewer and garbage (landfill) from unnecessary toxins” - “Transit” - “Disc swing for the parks” - “not so much a new swim facility, but a water table added, something for the little ones” - “better traffic flow” - “ a weekly community gathering – meals” - “moved here from the east coast. Love Lloyd!! More art culture and gathering – DANCES” - “Be able to put the nativity back up as you support everything else”



The jars has a total of 1010 jelly beans, which allows us to infer that 101 people completed out survey.
